


Our Council in Context

The New Zealand Resuscitation Council is the guideline and standard-setting body for resuscitation in New Zealand. It fosters and promotes excellence and consistency in the education and practice of resuscitation.


Organisations worldwide have aims similar to those of the New Zealand Resuscitation Council and are also represented on the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR).

The diagram here shows how we are connected to other international organisations. Dashed lines represent professional relationships, not reporting lines.



Our Operating Model

The New Zealand Resuscitation Council is a voluntary body of **member organisations** with an interest in resuscitation (see 'About Us' at www.nzrc.org.nz). Each member gets a seat at the Council table, and their representative is a 'councillor'. The current chair is Dr Richard Aickin.



Councillors collectively set the strategic direction of the Council. Each councillor has voting rights. The **Executive Committee** is made up of the Chair, Deputy Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer, and up to two other representatives from Council. The Executive Committee leads the implementation of the Council's strategic direction. It also oversees its fiscal management and compliance with legislation.

Staff are the National Administration Coordinator, Communications Officer, and Acting General Manager. They support the Council by carrying out day-to-day operations and tasks aligned to the strategic priorities. They also advise councillors on various matters but have no voting rights.
